

Steve Umculo releases new song upon his return from Nashville

Meet Steve Umculo. *Umculo* is the Zulu word for music. It is itself a representation of what Steve Umculo strives to achieve - a blend of cultures and styles. His music is a unique fusion of Afro-centric grooves and folk harmonies that will get any audience up on their feet.

Umculo recently released "Fall from Grace" - the title track from his forthcoming EP - across all digital platforms.

Umculo lived in Nashville, USA for a couple of months and the sound of "Fall from Grace" draws on the major folk influences that the 'music city' has to offer.

Your greatest achievement:


Playing at La Nit de Berklee in Valencia, Spain.
