

MTN and Huawei ink partnership agreement to bring digital services to Africa

MTN and Huawei have inked a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the objective to offer more digital services to African consumers and businesses.



The two corporations declared their strategy in a joint statement announcing an important part of their 17-year strategic working collaboration.
