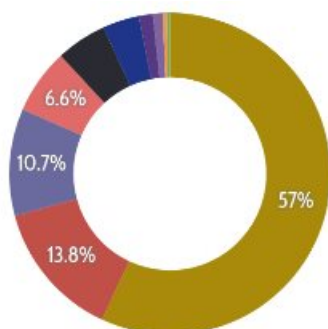


What's making headlines in SA?

The State Capture Inquiry is still on and this week, the nation was exposed to the happenings of the Gupta plane landing at Waterkloof and the consequent Gupta nuptial. The Commission of Inquiry into the Public Investment Corporation looked into the PIC's R21m loan to a bus company.
