- Traditional medicine, care, treatment, support and prevention
- Indigenous identities, world views and HIV discussions around "Indigeneity" in the South African context
- Meaningful engagement of women and girls working in HIV
- Leadership, advocacy and policy: social and structural drivers of HIV that create barriers for key affected populations
 most at risk of HIV.
