One Young World opens first African conference in October

The One Young World Summit 2013, scheduled for 2-5 October 2013 in Johannesburg, has announced its list of global leaders from business, politics, fashion, science and sport, who will act as counsellors. It is the first summit held in Africa, following previous events in London, Zurich and Pittsburgh.
