

# This week on social media

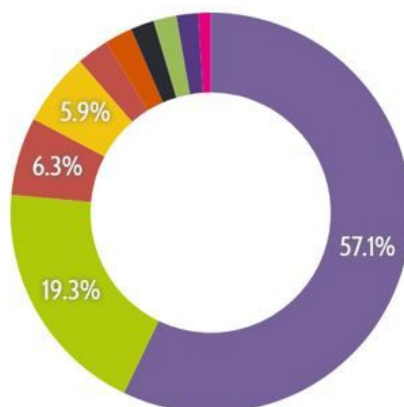
Let's have a look at this week's Acumen Media social media roundup.
