After an intense three days of competition at the Durban ICC for the National WorldSkills Competition, 23 of 65 medals over 19 categories were won by the WorldSkills Western Cape Team.



False Bay TVET College claimed 1 gold, 2 silver and 2 bronze, ranking them the best amongst their peers nationally in their field of study.

The WorldSkills Competition is a flagship event held every two years. It is the biggest vocational education and skills competition event in the world. The Competition truly reflects global participation from young people in industry and training providers. Competitors demonstrate their technical ability to execute specific tasks for which they are trained and perform in their workspace. One of the main legacies of the WorldSkills Competition is to highlight the importance of practical vocational education and training, as one of the major vehicles for socio-economic transformation
