

# Fak'ugesi Fest presents Beats Bloc Party 2018

The 2018 Fak'ugesi African Digital Innovation Festival will be held across Johannesburg from 24-29 September 2018. The annual Beats Programme will take place at the Tshimologong Precinct in Braamfontein over the six days.

Weheartbeat has curated a programme of workshops, experiences, and performances that will facilitate the meeting of mind and spirit in an environment geared around the festival's theme, 'Tap Your Afro Source Code'.



Nurturing collaboration and creativity, the Beats Lab presented by Red Bull Music will host international electronic artists in an exploration of the connection between music, design, technology, and digital innovation. The lab, which is a pop-up adaptation of the Red Bull Music Studio in Cape Town, will follow the same ethos of the studio and will run from 24-28 September with the participants embracing the theme, combining tradition with futurism. The outcome from these sessions will result in an EP release, a short documentary, and a live showcase performance at the Bloc Party. The artists featured in the 2018 Beats Lab are Potatohead People (Canada), S Fidelity (Switzerland), Zikomo (USA), Morena Leraba (Lesotho), and South African artists Bonj Mpanza and Hlasko.
